We explored the stunning Brecon Beacons, visited the amazing Blaen-Y-Glen waterfall and enjoyed the nature. We had lunch at Llangoss Lake, which has a lovely walk path and gift shop. We also went on the Brecon Mountain Railway – wonderful for sightseeing. We visited Craig-Y- Nos park and relaxed near its lakes, woods and greenery.



We wanted to give carers a break from their caring role and encourage them to be physically active in a fun way, as well as making friends and sharing experiences. Young people get a first taste of Mosaic in Exmoor

We provide young people with 'taster' sessions to experience what's on offer in National Parks before they sign up to become a Young Champion with our Mosaic youth project. On 31 May, Barney Simmons, our Exmoor project officer, organised the first 'taster' for five young people in Exmoor National Park.

In the morning they supervised wellie wanging at Exmoor National Park's Bogtastic Adventure Day, while in the afternoon they rolled up their sleeves and fixed dry stone walls at Hoccombe, right in the middle of the moor. They were supported and supervised by Dave, head of learning and outreach at Exmoor National Park. Jasper and family were visitors to
Viewpoint: The New Forest as Experienced
by Diverse Cultures Photo Exhibition at
New Forest Centre and Art Gallery in
Lyndhurst. It was organised by Community
Champions with the New Forest National
Park. The Community Champions curated
photos and paintings by local artists that
told the story of how the New Forest was
important to that particular artist.

It featured Irvin Verallo, Charisse Verallo, Rommel Nase, John Villanueva and Nestor Tatel from the Filipino community. The Chinese community presented Andy Lai's photo works while the Indian communities had Dimple Saturia and Latha's paintings and portraits. The Southampton Filipino Youth Club displayed a paper Mache tree to represent "a unity of various cultures."

The exhibition is part of a programme of activities for local communities that emphasise that the New Forest National Park is there to be enjoyed and explored by everyone. Nigel Matthew, NFNPA's community and visitor services manager said: "Our events programme is aimed at various communities because the National Park is there to be enjoyed by everyone and the New Forest is only waiting to be explored."







Northumberland Community Champions design a project in memory of Peter Nicholson

Last autumn Northumberland National Park lost a great advocate of Mosaic when Northumberland National Park Authority member Peter Nicholson sadly died following a heart operation. Peter was a man of integrity, unafraid to challenge the common opinion. He truly believed the countryside was for everyone and got to know the Northumberland Champions well through joining them on group leader visits.

In memory of Peter, Community
Champions are working with
Northumberland National Park
engagement officer, Mandy Roberts, and
our project officer, Paddy Villiers-Stuart,
to design a project that will allow young
and disadvantaged groups from
Newcastle to enjoy a residential
experience with a difference.

On 18 and 19 May Community Champions from the Angelou Centre and the Chinese Centre, both in the West End of Newcastle, visited the North Tyne and Redesdale areas in Northumberland National Park to try out some activities.

They stayed at Kielder Youth Hostel and tried out art workshops including art walks, book making, printing and large exterior artworks, at nearby studios of Visual Art in the Rural Community project (VARC) led by current and past artists in residence. In the evening they visited Kielder Observatory to learn what opportunities there are for studying the incredible dark skies in Northumberland.

The resulting group visits are planned for September 2013 and will involve around 50 people. Mandy Roberts said: "Peter would have been delighted at the new opportunities such as the Mosaic youth project that are developing to encourage people from urban communities to share in the benefits of our National Park. This year of workshops and days out is a fitting tribute."
